MY SOUND SITUATION

"Me and my daughter, me and my mother, me and my children, my brother and me, my father and me."

A dancer dances with her father, a dancer with his mother, another with his daughter, and a dancer with her children.

These primary relationships become choreographic material, where the physical encounter reveals layers of memory, care, and transformation. In a second phase, the performers improvise with the remaining sensations of that contact as their perceptual horizon: the impressions and what is transformed through them.

To traverse primary relationships in order to imprint other possible futures.

In this way, the work launches itself toward a poetic utopia: to bring together again what once carried the value of the inseparable, what defined us as bodies and which time diluted, transforming it into a mere space of separation and awareness.

To think of the primary body as human materiality, as an unorganized source of knowledge: what we were before language and the organization of reason.

A work that searches for lost dreams, silenced remnants, and that, through fiction and poetry, attempts to recover and invoke the knowledge of care in times when bodies no longer matter and cruelty is normalized.



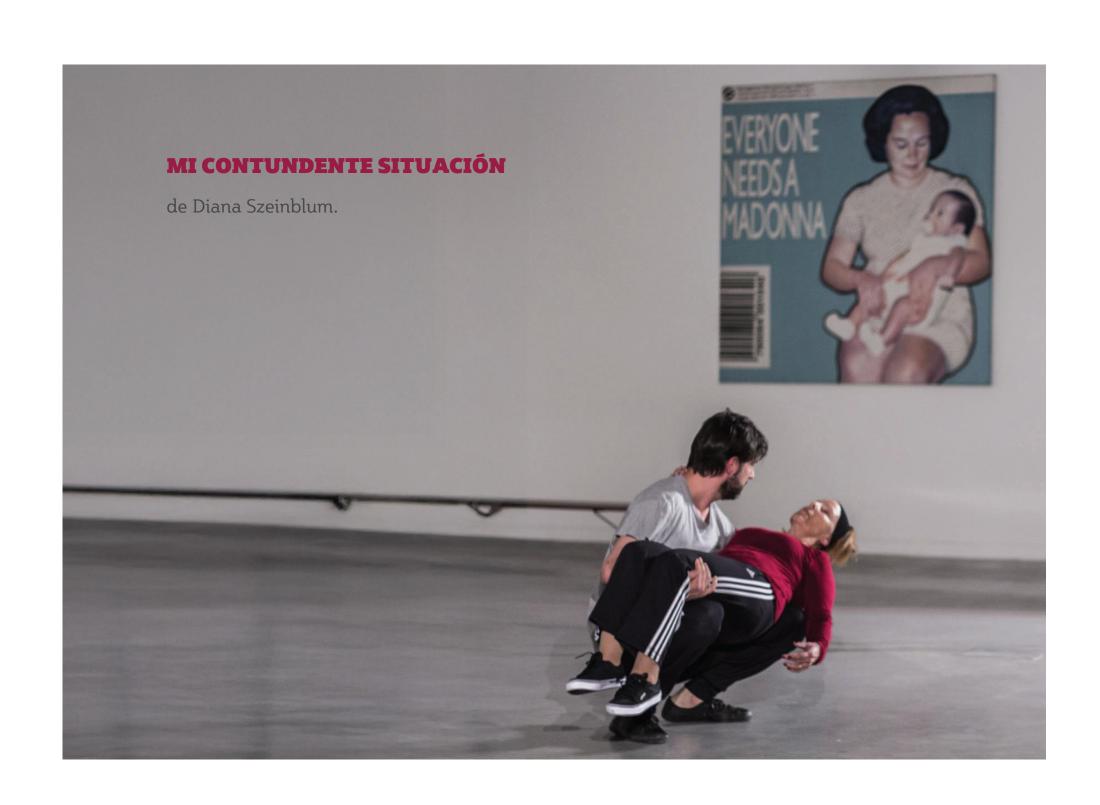

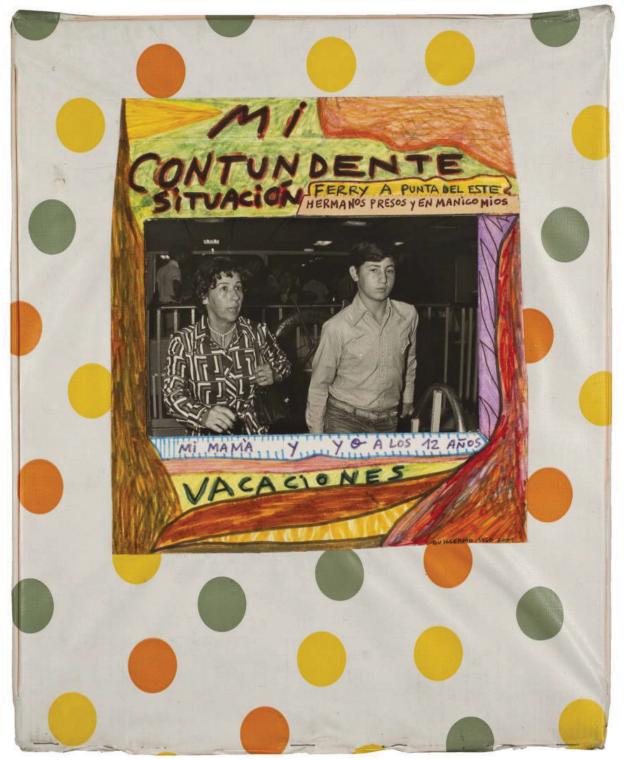
The selected artworks were photographs by Guillermo Iuso, Gravinese and Herrera.

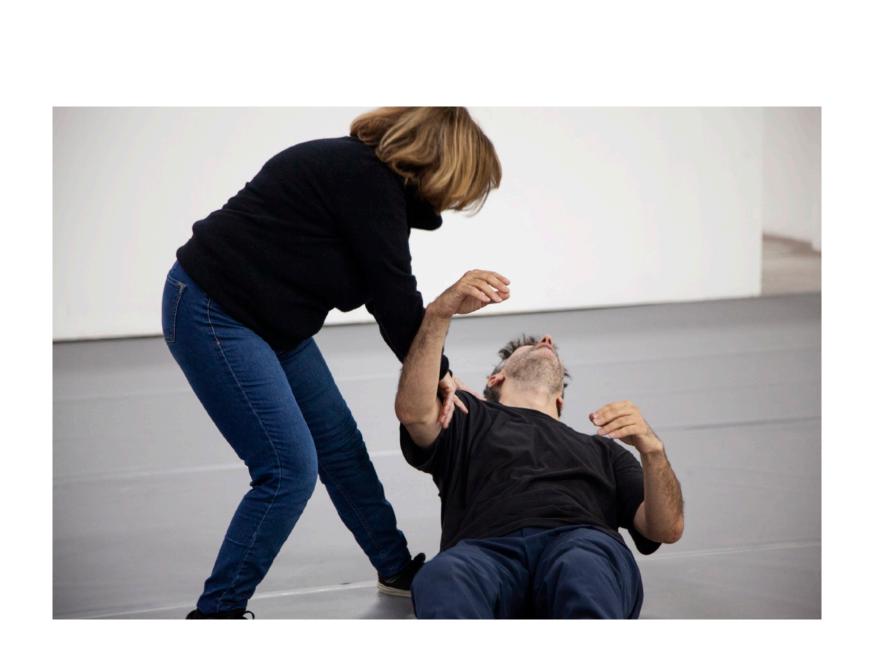

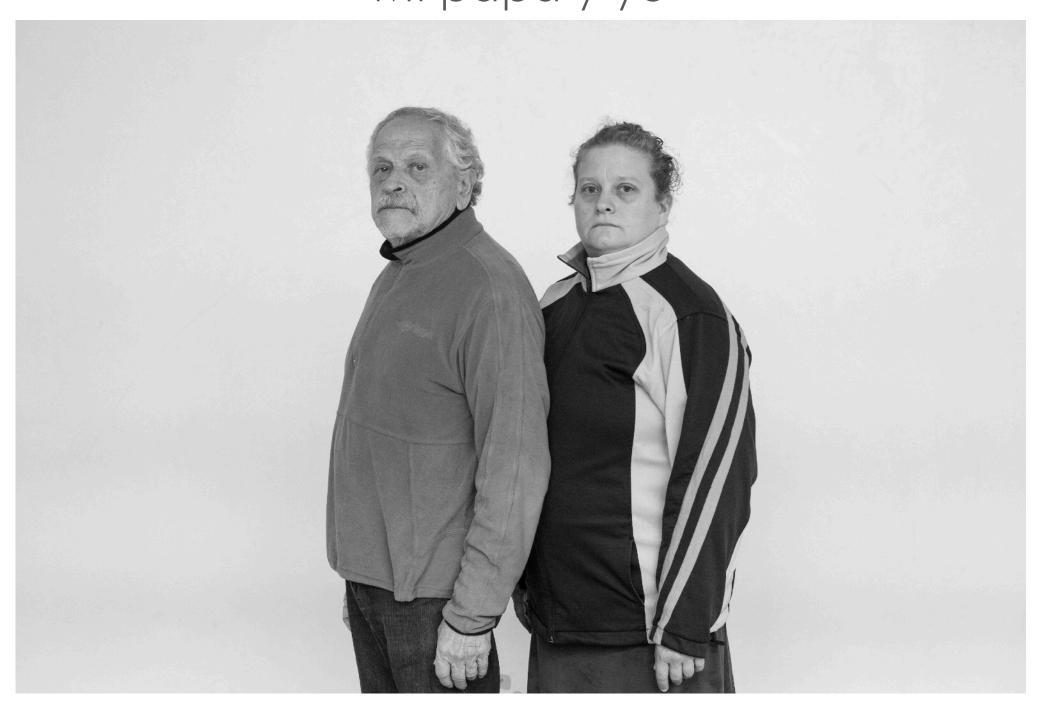

BIO Diana Szeinblum

Born in Argentina, she is a dancer, teacher, and choreographer.

She studied in Argentina, the United States, and later as a guest at the Folkwang Tanz Schule (Germany), where she subsequently joined the FTS company under the artistic direction of Pina Bausch.

As a choreographer, she moves between performance and the performing arts with works such as Secreto y Malibú (2000), Alaska (2007), Una cosa por vez (2013), Los Contempladores (2015), Adentro! (2016), Mi contundente situación (2017), Instrumento para estrellar (2018), Sistema 0 (2021), Obra del Demonio (2022), Meter el cuerpo en el archivo, meter el archivo en el cuerpo (2025).

She has been invited by the Experimental Centers of the Teatro Colón (CETC) and the Teatro Argentino de La Plata (TACEC), as well as Teatro La Rivera (CTBA).

She has created works for the Company of the Teatro General San Martín (Buenos Aires, 2003), Luna Negra Dance Company (Chicago, 2011), Grupo Tumakat (Mexico, 2012), and Compañía Nacional (2014).

Her performative works have been commissioned by Art Basel Cities, the Museum of Modern Art of Buenos Aires, FIDEBA Uruguay, the Buenos Aires Performance Biennial 2015 (BP15), the National Arts Fund, Faena Museum, the Museum of Contemporary Art Chicago, and the Walker Art Center Minneapolis. Her works have been invited to festivals and theaters across the Americas, Europe, and Asia.

She has received national and international grants and awards such as the Trinidad Guevara Prize, the National Performance Network, and the Teatro del Mundo Prize (UBA), among others.

She has published essays in books such as Time Is the Only Thing We Have (Caja Negra), The Texts of Dance (2(DA) en papel), and The Language of Dance (Editorial Excursiones).

She leads a creation clinic for interdisciplinary artists.
